## **Sermon overview**

This toolkit was created to accompany the Spring 2026 sermon series, Fully Devoted. Each section connects directly to a sermon that provides a big-picture overview. If you missed a message, you can watch it by visiting the link at the front of each section.

## **Tiered resources**

Each section includes resources organized into three general progressions: a beginning step, a next step, and an advanced step. These are not rigid or prescriptive. Instead, they are designed to help guide

you toward the next phase of becoming a more fully devoted follower of Jesus.

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## MARKS OF A **GROWING** DISCIPLE

- **A fully devoted follower of Christ prioritizes consistent time with God.**

A growing disciple intentionally builds space for Scripture reading and prayer into everyday life.

- **A fully devoted follower of Christ seeks transformation, not just information.**

A disciple approaches Scripture with humility and openness, asking not only what the Bible says, but how God is inviting them to live in response to His word.



## WHAT THE BIBLE SAYS

We believe that consistent Scripture reading and prayer are indispensable attributes of fully devoted followers of Christ. For the Christian, Bible reading and prayer are like breathing in and out. True transformation occurs when disciples consistently place themselves before God through the reading of His Word and a life of faithful prayer.

As evangelical Christians, we believe that God inspired all Scripture, which is infallible and inerrant, to reveal himself to man for us to believe, obey, and embrace (**2 Timothy 3:16-17**). Scripture was recorded by different men, yet ultimately authored and provided by the Spirit (**2 Peter 1:20-21**).

Jesus consistently emphasized God's Word as central to a faithful life (**Matthew 4:4**). Therefore, we believe that disciples who are growing as fully devoted followers make time daily to read and study God's inspired and inerrant word.

In Luke Jesus calls those blessed who hear the word of God and keep it (**Luke 11:28**). Hearing the Word of God is essential to faith (**Romans 10:17**), but it does not stand alone. Blessing flows not merely from exposure to truth, but from submission to it as we allow it to reshape our lives.

Therefore, we desire to see every believer become a fully devoted follower of Christ by hearing and doing the word (**James 1:22**) and committing to consistent communion with God in prayer.

## TO START /

### Find a Bible

There may be a few questions that arise as you search for a Bible. Should you choose a print Bible or an app? Which translation is best?

#### ***Bible Format***

There are two main ways to access the Bible:

**PRINT** - Best for highlighting important verses and making notes directly alongside the passage as you listen to sermons or lessons. Print Bibles are often more conducive to an unplugged, focused time with God.

**APP** - There are a lot of options available, but YouVersion is the most common Bible app. The advantages of a Bible app include the ability to read anywhere at any time. In addition, many apps allow you to listen to the Bible audibly.

#### ***Translation***

The “best” translation is the one that best suits your needs. Some translations prioritize readability, while others aim for word-for-word accuracy. There are many options available, but here are a few recommendations:

**English Standard Version (ESV)** - Leans slightly toward a word-for-word translation. Used at FBC during sermons and Scripture reading.

**New Living Translation (NLT)** - Prioritizes clarity and readability.

**New International Reader's Version (NirV)** - Written at a third grade reading level. Used at FBC in children's ministry.

*Need an ESV Bible? We have them for free in the back of the worship center at the welcome desk.*

## **Follow a Bible reading plan**

If you're already using a Bible reading plan, that's okay! It is helpful to have a schedule of readings so that you can consistently read the Bible daily.

If you are not currently in a Bible reading plan, here are two resources we recommend. See the appendix at the back of this book for a daily reading schedule.

### F260

Bible Reading Plan

Covers the Bible while skipping repetitive passages, completing the plan in 260 days per year (about five days per week). Recommended for new Bible readers.



/biblerecap

Covers every verse of the Bible and includes a short daily summary video to help you understand what you read. Recommended for Bible readers who want help comprehending Scripture.

## ... AND THEN //

### Get a prayer journal

Having a prayer journal is a helpful way to stay focused and consistent in prayer. Over time, you'll be able to look back and see how God was shaping you through different seasons of life. A journal can also serve as a meaningful place to take sermon notes.

You can use any basic notebook you already have. If you're looking for something more structured, consider using a dedicated prayer journal.

## Pray strategically

While you can always pray to God about whatever is on your heart, it can be helpful to have a guide that shapes and broadens your prayers. Below are two simple frameworks to help structure your prayer time.

### ***ACTS Prayer Method***

**Adoration** - What is it about God you love?

**Confession** - What sins do I need to confess?

**Thanksgiving** - What am I thankful for?

**Supplication** - What do I need to ask him for?

### ***Lord's Prayer Model***

**Position** - Humble yourself before God

**Adoration** - Glorify and praise God for who he is

**Submission** - Seek God's will and surrender to it

**Petition** - Ask God for daily provision and guidance

**Confession** - Confess your sins honestly before God

**Exhortation** - Plead for God's spiritual protection

# GATHERING

DISCIPLE

- **A fully devoted follower of Christ commits to consistently gathering with other believers.**

Disciples prioritize gathering with other believers through corporate worship and small groups, recognizing that faith was never meant to be lived in isolation.

- **A fully devoted follower of Christ engages honestly in community.**

Growth requires vulnerability. Fully devoted followers move beyond surface-level interaction into honest, grace-filled relationships.



## WHAT THE BIBLE SAYS

When Jesus was on earth, he consistently gathered his disciples together in community, calling them to follow him together rather than alone. In the wake of Jesus' death and resurrection, His disciples gathered together to form the early church.

As the early church gathered they became a Spirit-empowered community unified by faith in Christ, committed to the apostles' teaching, worship, prayer, and mutual care, spreading the good news of the kingdom into the world.

The Spirit of God spoke to the early followers, warning them not to neglect meeting together but to consider how to stir one another up to love and good works **(Hebrews 10:24–25)**.

Therefore, we believe that God calls his disciples today to gather regularly with one another, unified in community through teaching, worship, prayer, and encouraging one another toward faithfulness and love.

Through corporate worship and small group gatherings fully devoted followers of Christ engage honestly in community. Rather than remaining at a surface level, mature disciples open their lives to others in grace-filled relationships where they can be known, encouraged, challenged, and strengthened in their walk with Christ.

Every November, we enjoy a Thanksgiving meal together as a church family.

Story time takes place on the first Tuesday of every month at 10:00 a.m. This is a great opportunity for parents and grandparents to connect with one another.

## MARKS OF A GATHERING DISCIPLE

### **Sunday School Classes**

Sunday School meets every Sunday from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., immediately following worship. There are two types of classes available:

**Term** - Designed for short-term study. Teachers and curriculum rotate periodically, allowing members to explore topics of interest.

**Legacy** - Ongoing classes that retain the same teacher and meet year-round, designed to foster long-term and deeper relationships.

### **Mid-Week Discipleship Groups**

We also believe it is essential for believers to gather during the week. These groups are offered for young adults, men, and women.

### **Missions-Focused Groups**

We believe in gathering together for the sake of the gospel. Several groups meet monthly to pray for the nations and engage in missions-related activities.



## /// ... AND THEN YOU CAN

### **Build relationships outside of regular church activities**

It is important to get to know other believers outside of regular church hours. Here are two ways you can do this:

#### **Invite a church family into your home.**

Smaller, informal gatherings in a casual home environment are great spaces to build meaningful relationships and live out our faith together.

#### **Invite a church member to lunch.**

Sharing a meal during the week is a simple and effective way to get to know others in an informal setting.

### **Lead a small group**

As part of our commitment to developing future leaders, we encourage every small group to invest in training the next generation. If you've been part of a small group for a while, consider speaking with your leader about being trained to lead.

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## MARKS OF A **GIVING** DISCIPLE

- **A fully devoted follower of Christ consistently gives financially to the work of ministry.**

Disciples give regularly, generously, and cheerfully in obedience as a response to God's abundant grace.

- **A fully devoted follower of Christ consistently serves God with their time and giftings.**

Disciples actively use their gifts and time, volunteering in various ministries within the church.



## WHAT THE BIBLE SAYS

Jesus spoke often about money and service because both reveal the heart. He taught that “where your treasure is, there your heart will be also” (**Matthew 6:21**), showing that generosity is not merely financial but deeply spiritual. Jesus consistently called His followers to trust God as their provider rather than relying on possessions or comfort (**Matthew 6:33**).

Jesus also declared that “the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve” (**Mark 10:45**) and modeled humility by giving His time, strength, and life for others. Giving—both financially and through service—is a response to grace and a reflection of Christ’s own generosity.

We believe that a fully devoted follower of Christ gives faithfully and consistently, viewing financial generosity as an act of worship that supports the ministry of the church and the mission of the gospel (**1 Corinthians 16:1-2**).

Rather than giving out of obligation or convenience (2 **Corinthians 9:7**), they respond to God's grace with joyful stewardship, trusting Him as their provider and investing their resources in what has eternal significance.

Devoted followers give consistently through both financial generosity and faithful service, making stewardship a regular rhythm of life.

## Give to special offerings

We encourage members to participate in select special offerings throughout the year. Information about how and when to give to these offerings will be shared as each opportunity approaches.

### Hope for Life (January)

Bring cash and coins to fill baby bottles that support Mayfield’s Hope Center, a ministry serving young mothers in our community.

### Annie Armstrong Easter Offering (March)

This offering supports church planting efforts through the North American Mission Board (NAMB). One of the church plants we support is partially funded through NAMB.

### Sunrise Children’s Services (May)

Sunrise is a ministry of the Kentucky Baptist Convention that provides foster care, adoption services, and orphan care.



## MARKS OF A GIVING DISCIPLE

### **Arizona Sponsorships (June)**

Each year, we host a youth camp for Native American and Congolese students in Arizona. Sponsorships help send students to camp.

### **Founders' Day (August)**

This offering celebrates the founding of our church and carries a different emphasis each year, often with a missions focus.

### **Eliza Broadus Offering (September)**

The Kentucky Women's Missionary Union (WMU) takes up an annual offering for missions in Kentucky.

### **Global Hunger Relief (October)**

In partnership with the Kentucky Baptist Convention, this offering helps provide meals to food-insecure households throughout Kentucky.

### **Operation Christmas Child (November)**

We pack and collect shoeboxes filled with hygiene items, toys, and other gifts to support Samaritan's Purse in sharing the gospel worldwide.

### **Lottie Moon Christmas Offering (December)**

This offering supports missionaries serving around the world through the International Mission Board (IMB).



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## MARKS OF A **GOING** DISCIPLE

- **A fully devoted follower of Christ shares the gospel consistently with unbelievers.**

Disciples go with intentionality, proclaiming the gospel and seeking to make disciples among those who do not yet believe.

- **A fully devoted follower of Christ engages in His redeeming work among the nations.**

Disciples pray for the unreached, support and send missionaries, and personally participate in mission opportunities as the Lord calls.



## WHAT THE BIBLE SAYS

Jesus made it clear that following Him includes being sent by Him. Before ascending to the Father, He commanded His disciples to “go and make disciples of all nations” (**Matthew 28:19**), calling every follower into God’s mission. Sharing the gospel flows from knowing Jesus and making Him known.

Jesus described His followers as witnesses, empowered by the Holy Spirit to testify to what they had experienced (**Acts 1:8**). He promised His presence, reminding His disciples that obedience—not results—is the measure of faithfulness, and that He would be with them always (**Matthew 28:20**).

We believe that a fully devoted follower of Jesus actively participates in His redeeming work both at home and among the nations. Christ calls all His followers to bear witness to the gospel in the context of their daily lives, work, and communities.

In addition, followers are called to engage in His mission globally, viewing their time, resources, relationships, and influence as instruments for advancing God's kingdom. They long to see unreached people hear the name of Jesus and respond in faithful obedience to his call.

## TO START /

### Learn to use a gospel sharing method

It can be helpful to study and practice a specific tool for sharing the gospel so that you're prepared when opportunities arise. Below are several gospel-sharing methods we recommend.

#### ***Creation-Fall-Redemption-Restoration***

##### ***Creation***

God created everything good and designed humanity to know Him, reflect His image, and live under His loving rule.

##### ***Fall***

Humanity rebelled against God, choosing sin and independence over trust and obedience. This rebellion fractured our relationship with God, with one another, and with creation itself.

##### ***Redemption***

God did not abandon His broken world but acted in love to rescue it through Jesus Christ. Through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, sin is forgiven and broken relationships with God are restored for those who repent and believe.

## **Restoration**

God is renewing all things and will one day fully restore creation to what He intended from the beginning. Those who belong to Christ will live forever in His presence, where sin, and death are no more.

## **God's Plan for Me**

We use this method in our children's ministry.



### **GOD RULES**

Because God made the world, He makes the rules.



### **WE SINNED**

We all break those rules, deserving death.



### **GOD PROVIDED**

God provided his Son, Jesus, to die in our place.



### **JESUS GIVES**

He rose from the dead 3 days later, defeating death. Jesus takes our sin and gives us righteousness.



### **WE RESPOND**

We turn from sin and turn to Christ for forgiveness. He promises eternal life in heaven with Him!



This method is especially helpful for those who are visually oriented.

## Practice

Practice sharing the gospel using this method with a familiar person, perhaps your spouse or believing friend.

## Pray

This is so important! Pray that God would give you witnessing opportunities **AND** the boldness to share.

Pray also that God would prepare the hearts of those you will be sharing with, so that they may hear and respond in faith and repentance to the gospel.

## Turn everyday conversations to gospel conversations

There are many natural ways to move from everyday conversations to gospel conversations. Below are several practical bridges you can use.

### Church Bridge

- "Were you brought up in a particular religious tradition?"
- "Do you attend church?" "What does your church teach about the way a person becomes a Christian?"



### **Intellectual Bridge**

- "Has anyone ever shared with you how to have a personal relationship with God?"

### **Personal Opinion Bridge**

- "In your personal opinion, what is a Christian?"
- "What do you think of \_\_\_\_\_?" (God, Jesus Christ, religion, the Bible, meaning of life, etc.)

### **Felt Needs Bridge**

(Used to show how the Gospel answers the deepest needs of people)

- "You know, I still have my share of problems, but having a personal relationship with Jesus Christ has made all the difference in how I handle them! I used to worry myself sick; God is teaching me how to have peace in the midst of the storms of life."

### **Prayer Bridge**

- "Is there something I could pray about for you?"

### **Heaven Bridge**

- What do you think happens to a person after they die?
- What is your belief about heaven and hell?

## Set up a gospel appointment

At times, shifting an everyday conversation toward spiritual matters can feel forced. In those moments, consider setting up a gospel appointment—a future conversation where the other person knows you want to share something meaningful.

You might invite them like this:

“Sarah, we’ve been friends for a long time. We’ve talked about many things, but there’s an important part of my life I’ve never shared with you. Could we grab lunch next Tuesday so I can tell you what God has done in my life?”

Gospel appointments often remove pressure and create a more natural environment for spiritual conversations.

**Remember**—if you don’t know the answer to a question, that’s okay. You can simply say, “I don’t know, but I’d love to find out and talk again.” This often opens the door for continued gospel conversations.

## ... AND THEN //

### **Be a part of a mission-focused group**

Mission-focused groups allow you to partner with others who share a passion for missions and the Great Commission.

#### **Prayer Team for the Nations**

This group meets monthly to pray for and support missionaries connected to FBC Mayfield. Each member is directly connected to a specific missionary and commits to faithfully “holding the rope” through prayer, encouragement, and communication.

#### **Women on Mission**

Meeting monthly, the Kentucky Women’s Missionary Union (WMU) helps believers live out the Great Commission and supports churches in developing a missional culture. Members participate in hands-on mission projects, leadership training, and mission opportunities locally and globally.

## Go on mission

God calls His people to take the gospel into new contexts—locally, regionally, and internationally.

### LOCAL OPPORTUNITIES

#### **Ramp Building Ministry**

This ministry shares the love of Christ by building wheelchair ramps for individuals facing mobility challenges. Volunteers meet practical needs while building relationships and sharing the gospel.

#### **Laundry Ministry**

Volunteers visit local laundromats, provide funds for laundry, and engage individuals in meaningful conversations—offering prayer and sharing the hope found in Jesus Christ.

#### **Vacation Bible School**

Each June, we host over 130 children from the community for Vacation Bible School. This is a powerful opportunity to share the gospel with children and their families, both on campus and through neighborhood outreach.

#### **Needline and Food Pantry**

Volunteer with the Mayfield–Graves County Needline and Food Pantry as they serve individuals and families in need throughout our community.



## REGIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

### **Arizona Mission Trip**

Each year, FBC Mayfield partners with Live Love Ministries to host a youth camp for Native American and Congolese teenagers in Arizona, sharing the gospel and building relationships across cultures.

### **Kentucky Disaster Relief (KYDR)**

Kentucky Disaster Relief serves communities affected by disaster through debris clean-up, roof tarping, mass feeding, chaplaincy, flood recovery, and other response efforts.

## INTERNATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

### **Dubai Mission Trip**

This team supports gospel work in one of the most unreached regions of the world. Volunteers serve alongside local missionaries and engage in gospel conversations throughout the city.
